Lance H. Baumgard

Lance Baumgard is an associate professor and the Norman L. Jacobson Endowed Professor of Nutritional Physiology in the Department of Animal Science at Iowa State University. Baumgard's research focuses on environmental and nutritional physiology of lactating and growing ruminants, with an emphasis on postabsorptive carbohydrate and lipid metabolism. His research program also evaluates ration ingredients and management practices. Before coming to Iowa State University, Baumgard was an assistant professor and then an associate professor at the University of Arizona in Tucson. Baumgard won the 2007 ADSA Cargill Animal Nutrition Young Scientist award and the 2009 ADSA Foundation Scholar award. Baumgard obtained his BS and MS degrees from the University of Minnesota and his PhD from Cornell University.

Tim F. Brown

Tim Brown currently serves as the director of technical support for the Soy and Nutrition division of West Central COOP, Ralston, Iowa, and is responsible for providing support and training for the sales force representing SoyPLUS and SoyChlor. In addition, he interacts with dairy nutritionists and dairy feed manufacturers throughout North America and assists them with their dairy nutrition objectives. He has served West Central in this capacity since July of 2009. Before joining West Central, Brown worked for seven years as a dairy nutrition and technical services representative for Land O'Lakes Purina Feeds. His primary responsibilities were providing nutrition services and continuing education to local cooperatives, as well as working directly as a nutritionist and management specialist for dairies and for heifer developers in Kansas, Nebraska, and Iowa, with periodic assignments in Missouri, Illinois, Minnesota, and South Dakota. Prior to his jobs in the dairy industry, Brown held a 100% teaching appointment from 1994 through 2001 in the Department of Animal Sciences at Tarleton State University in Stephenville, Texas, and a 100% research appointment from 1984 to 1994 at the Louisiana Agricultural Experiment Station in Franklinton, Louisiana.

Brown received his BS degree in animal sciences from Virginia Tech in 1976 and his MS (animal nutrition, 1979) and PhD (ruminant nutrition, 1984) degrees from Kansas State University. He and his wife, Susan, reside in Westmoreland, Kansas, and their son, Billy, will graduate from Kansas State University in May 2010 with a degree in animal sciences and industry.
